Welcome

Prelude: In the Bulb There is a Flower

Acknowledgement of the Land: We acknowledge that the people of St. Peter's worship and serve on Treaty 1 territory, the traditional lands of the Anishinaabe, Cree and Dakota peoples and the homeland of the Red River Métis nation. In particular, our parish building is located near the site of the displaced Métis community of Rooster Town. The intent of the treaties was to share the gifts of the land for the benefit of all. We acknowledge the harms that have been done. We commit to walking together with Indigenous peoples on the path toward justice, truth and reconciliation.

The Apostles' Creed

Officiant: Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say
All: **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**
I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was
conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin
Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and
was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose
again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand
of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the

communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of

Confession and Absolution

Officiant: Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; God welcomes sinners and enfolds us in his embrace. Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.
(pause for silent reflection)

Officiant: Most merciful God,
All: **we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and**
deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved
our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly
repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and
forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your
ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Presider: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: **Amen.**

Presider: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: **And also with you.**

Prayer of Thanksgiving and Hope

Presider: In union, O Lord, with your faithful people at every altar of your Church, we offer you praise and thanksgiving for your presence among us. Through a time of challenge and isolation we have been blessed with the gift of community in ways we could not have imagined. Your sure presence has sustained us through our long absence from your table. We remember your death, Lord Christ; we proclaim your resurrection; we await your coming in glory. Though we cannot receive you today in the gifts of bread and wine, we thank you that we have received the sacrament of your presence, the forgiveness of sins, and all other benefits of your passion; and we look forward to the day when we will once again stand together around your table. Cleanse and strengthen us with your grace, that we may never be separated from you. May we live in you, and you in us, in this life and in the life to come. Amen.

Presider: As our Saviour taught us, let us pray,

All: **Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil.**

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Presider: Living God, guide and protect your people who share in the community of your love. Grant that we may show your love in our whole being so that we may honour you not only with our lips but in our lives, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Presider: Glory to God,

All: **whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine. Glory to God from generation to generation, in the Church and in Christ Jesus, forever and ever. Amen.**

THE SENDING FORTH

Presider: The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of His Son Jesus Christ our Lord: And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit be amongst you and remain with you always. Amen.

Closing Hymn: Sing Hallelujah to Our God [(*found at 492 in CP*), all vs.]

Sing hallelujah to our God, sing out in glad and glorious praise;
let "Holy, holy" be your song with all your heart, through all your days,
for holy is the name we know in highest heaven and earth below,
