Growing in Wisdom: Seeking Deeper Generativity

This is an ecumenical program, grounded in the mystical Christian Tradition, open to learning from other interfaith and spiritual traditions, and designed for those seeking to engage in their maturing years with wisdom and grace. It is a program that welcomes participants who have the time, interest, and energy to engage in a dynamic two-year adventure of learning and exploration. How do I give my life to the world? And how do I prepare for eventual illness, diminishment and death, so that my death is my final blessing to my family, community and the world? This program is rooted in the Forest Dwelling Program, Oblate School of Theology, and the ground-breaking work of Fr. Ron Rolheiser OMI. The program involves four 5-day intensives (September and February) over two years, monthly meetings with other participants in Elder Circles, a monthly meeting with a spiritual director, and optional monthly book studies. The **Growing in Wisdom** program is primarily offered on zoom. Applications are now being accepted for the September 2023 – June 2025 program. St. Matthew's-Maryland Community Ministry and 1JustCity – Then and Now

Perhaps you have been wondering about the history of St. Peter's with St. Matthew's-Maryland Community Ministry (StMMCM) and why we seldom hear that name anymore. Instead, each week we pray for the West End site of 1JustCity. Over the next 3 weeks, your Outreach Ministry Team will offer some background and an update on where we are today.

Week 1 - Origin:

Loving our West End Neighbours.... For a long time, this phrase was used to capture the work happening at St Matthew's- Maryland Community Ministry. Following what is asked of us as Christians, Anglicans in Rupert's Land heard a call to love and support our neighbours in the West End of Winnipeg. In 1972 St Matthew's- Maryland Community Ministry (StMMCM) was formed as a joint project of St Matthew's Anglican Church and Maryland United Church. Out of a generous heart, the Parish of St Matthew chose to offer a gift-in-kind, providing the heat, water, light and the space for the newly formed ministry. This gift-in-kind held a value of \$22,000, per annum.

This arrangement held until the transformation of the building of St Matthew's parish in 2012-13. The very building itself was transformed into the **West End Commons**, an entity that would then own the building. Fully renovated, the new West End Commons holds 26 apartments, offering affordable housing and a sense of community for the residential tenants. St Matthew's Anglican parish became simply one of the community-based tenants, required to pay rent for its own space in the West End Commons. By the same token, St Matthew's-Maryland Community Ministry became a tenant, required to pay rent without the possibility of the gift-in-kind from St Matthew's Parish church. Stay tuned for next steps in next week's bulletin.
