Sermon

(*pause for silent reflection*)

The Apostles' Creed

Officiant: Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say
All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Confession and Absolution

Officiant: Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; God welcomes sinners and invites us to this table. Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.

Officiant: Most merciful God,
All: we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Presider: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Presider: The peace of Christ be with you.

All: And also with you.

Procession of the Gifts

Officiant: From the abundance of God's creation we bring forward bread and wine and offer them to God.

Officiant: The table for our celebration of the Eucharist will now be prepared as we sing the offertory hymn.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider: We give you thanks and praise, to proclaim the glory of your name.

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might.

Presider: Holy and gracious God, accept our praise,.....

The Breaking of the Bread

Presider: We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All: We, being many, are one body, for we all share in the one bread.

Here, Lord, we take the broken bread and drink the wine,
believing that by thy life our souls are fed, thy parting gifts receiving.

As thou hast given, so we would give ourselves for others' healing;
as thou hast lived, so we would live, the Father's love revealing.

Communion Hymn: CP#70 Jesus, the Joy of Loving Hearts

Jesus, the joy of loving hearts, true source of life, our lives sustain;
from the best bliss that earth imparts, we turn unfilled to you again.

Your truth unchanged has ever stood; you rescue those who on you call:
to those yet seeking, you are good; to those who find you, all in all.

We taste of you, the living bread, and long to feast upon you still.

We drink from you, the fountain head; our thirsty souls from you we fill.

Our restless spirits long for you, however may our lot be cast,
glad when your gracious smile we view, blessed when our faith can hold
you fast.
