THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

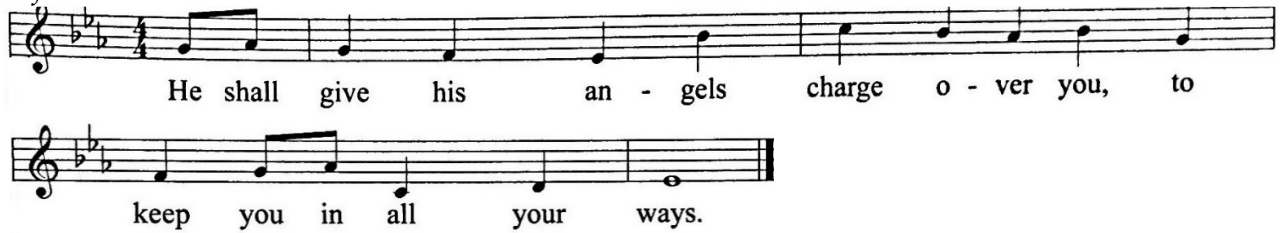
Lesson: Isaiah 53:4-12

Confession and Absolution

Officiant: Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; God welcomes sinners and enfolds us in his embrace. Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.

Presider: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Officiant: **Amen.**

Peace

Presider: May the peace of Christ be with you all.

All: **And also with you.**

Prayer of Lament

Presider: Compassionate God, your heart of love is grieved at the suffering of the world you made and long to save. We, too, grieve for the pain of the world and for the many losses we all have endured and continue to endure. Through our tears and inarticulate groans, we trust that your Spirit intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words.

In this time of exile, when we cannot gather at your altar to receive the sacred Body and Blood of your Son, we bring our worship and praise for all you give us. In gratitude for all the blessings you pour upon us, we unite ourselves to you with all our hearts, our souls, our minds, and our strength. Teach us patience and restraint. Give us your compassion. Shape us into a people sent to serve, heal, and bring hope to your world and all its inhabitants, so that, by the breathing of your Spirit, a new creation may come to birth. We ask this through Jesus Christ, who came that all might have abundant life. Amen.

Lord's Prayer

Presider: As our Saviour Christ has taught us, let us pray:

Presider: Come Lord Jesus, and dwell in our hearts in the fullness of your strength; be our wisdom and guide us in right pathways; conform our lives and actions to the image of your holiness; and, in the power of your gracious might, rule over every hostile power that threatens or disturbs the growth of your kingdom, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. Amen.

Presider: Glory to God

All: **whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine. Glory to God from generation to generation, in the Church and in Christ Jesus, forever and ever. Amen.**
